## From the Pastor's Study

On Saturday June 20, sixty people from Congregation Shir Shalom and First Congregational Church gathered to sing songs of peace and share in a common feast prepared by everyone present. The idea began as a seed during my first month here. Then through a lot of tender care, the selecting and practicing of songs, the help of members of both congregations who helped with logistics, and the extra musical talent of Taras Lumiere and Kyle St. John, we enjoyed the power of music to build a community of peace.

In the shadow of the recent tragedy just two days before our event, in which nine African-American people were killed in the historic Emmanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church, our Songs of Peace program could not have come at a more appropriate time. We sang several songs that we are a part of the civil rights movement 60 years ago. "When will we ever learn?" May our prayers and our commitment to social justice remain as deep and strong as a tree planted by the waters.

It was a lot of fun for me to play music with the guitar-and-harmonica-playing Rabbi Steve, who ended the event by singing us all into a circle dance. We will do this again, perhaps by the light of a campfire.



I want to share with you a quote from one of Rabbi Steve's newsletter columns; "May the community continue to be strengthened by virtue of the spiritual lives of the individuals that assemble together to make things happen."

In times like these, we need congregations that provide resources that enable and empower individuals on their faith journey so that we, as a vital and faithful community, can help heal this broken world.

We need to find ways to assemble together; learning and worshipping, serving and playing. We need to make things happen so that we have a sense of meaning and purpose as we embody the faith practices of the progressive Christian Community.

One of the things I have observed is that it is difficult to know who is in charge here at FCC Sonoma. That doesn't mean that good things are not happening here, because I have seen them. I have also seen a bit of wandering in the wilderness with folks not knowing how decisions are made and who has the authority to make them.

As much as I believe that music builds community, I also believe that clear job descriptions, and a good organizational design, help to build strong, vital, and exuberant communities. As Congregationalists we find both the job descriptions and the design in our Bylaws. (The Bible also helps, but we didn't write that).

I want to share with you a question that I have about one particular design aspect of the Bylaws. This is the only church I have ever served where the Chairs of each Committee do not serve as members of the Council. It is easy to imagine that at some point the Chairs of all the Committees grew weary of attending two meetings a month. So it was decided that the Officers and the At-Large Members of the Council would serve as a liaisons and thereby attend, -- two meetings a month.

It is my observation, so far, is that this design is not serving you well. Not only is the communication between the Committees and the Council not flowing well, you also do not have the benefit of the active leaders of the congregation sharing their knowledge and understanding of the needs of the church as a whole. I will remain curious and see if we are simply not following the directions, or if in fact we need a new design.

Fortunately the Bylaws also include our Church's Covenant, which close with the following words, "The Members of this Church, with all the faith our Christian growth makes possible, do covenant together in the presence of God:...to love and support one another, to listen and learn from one another, to forgive and trust one another, to pray for and with one another, to answer God's call to be the body of Christ."

May we all keep practicing our virtues and make things happen for a just peace church.

# Committee News and Updates

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## Earth Care

Rev. Alan Claassen, John Donnelly and Helen Rowntree joined California Interfaith Power & Light (CIPL) at the State Capitol on June 17 to lobby for more Earth-friendly legislation. CIPL is a statewide network of 650 member congregations of all major faith traditions working together for climate action. Thirty-one CIPL lobbyist were organized into seven small groups to meet with 47 State Assembly Members and Senators urging them to pass climate action bills. Special focus was given to bills that would accelerate California's global leadership to reduce further greenhouse gases (SB 32 and SB 350), and to bills that would assist disadvantaged communities disproportionately impacted by climate change (AB 156, AB 1062).

## Hospitality

**FOOD FOR THOUGHT** - Many of us have put aside "emergency food" to be prepared for the next earthquake. Sometimes overlooked is "emergency water storage". The MINIMUM water supply is 1 gallon per person per day, and common sense suggests storing enough for 3-5 days (5 gallons for each person). CDC recommends changing stored water every 6 months. If you do not have enough water stored, there are safe sources in your home that may provide clean water for drinking. Sources include: water drained from the water heater faucet, water dipped from the TANK of the toilet (water from the bowl can be used for pets), melted ice cubes, and liquids from canned goods.

We appreciate the many food contributions you have made to after church "hospitality" time. If you haven't done so for a while, please sign the board which will be in the community room during hospitality time. Ideally, it's nice to have three people bring treats....perhaps, sweet, savory and fruit or vegetables from our abundant local farms.

## At Our June 7 Congregational Meeting

Members present unanimously passed the Amendment to the Bylaws for Taking a Public Stand presented by Ellen LaBruce and Garen Patterson. In the introduction to the Amendment Ellen and Garen wrote,

"In following our mission, there are times when we feel called to take a public stand on issues of Peace and Justice. Discerning whether to do this helps to test our values in practical, worldly terms. And having the church as a whole take a public stand can send a powerful message and define who we are as a community of faith.

As important as a position may be, the process by which we come to that decision is also important, one in which all are truly heard and the decision is based on mutual respect and trust.

The framework for deciding when and how to take a stand on important social issues in a way that brings our church community together even when discussing controversial issues."

Through the end of May the church's income is under budget and expenses are also under budget.

Income budgeted \$96,930  
Income received \$94,684

Expenses budgeted \$98,270  
Expenses actual \$92,393

The church's budgeted income is as follows:  
60% comes from pledges/offerings including the Thrift Store pledge of 50% of sales.  
25% comes from leased space which includes Congregation Shir Shalom, Old Adobe School, and the Thrift Store.  
15% comes from rented space and other.
